

Bus stop: La Sole

The ILLICO line 3 serves the university sector every 10 minutes from 5:30 am to 9:30 pm

In the evening, on Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, these buses run in the Minimes area every 30 minutes from 10:15 pm to 1 am

SEA BUS

The Sea Bus provides a link between the Historic Port and the Minimes pleasure port.

Two boarding points:

- Historic Port (near the Tour de la Chaîne tower)
- Minimes pleasure port (between quai Lazaret and Ponton 10)

Sea bus ticket: €3 one-way ticket

SELF-SERVICE BIKE: HOW DOES IT WORK?



1 REGISTER

To use a Yélo self-service bike, there are 4 registration ways:

- Download the Freebike app, available on iPhone and Android, and create your account;
- Create your account on the Freebike website: freebike.paryelo.fr;
- Go to one of the bike stations and use the touchscreen;
- Or go to the Maison de la Mobilité, Place de Verdun in La Rochelle.

Then select the desired formula (Fares: yelo.scoop.airweb.fr).

2 RENT A BIKE

Once registered, 3 ways to pick up a bike:

- Use the Freebike app by Yélo, and scan the QR code of the desired bike;
- Log in via the station screen with your ID and PIN code;
- If you have a Yélo card, place it in front of the target to the right of the station screen.

Remove the bike when the light flashes quickly and beeps.

3 RETURN THE BIKE

Once your ride is over, hang up the bike back at a station (please do not press the station button).

A green light indicates that the bike is securely hang up.

A red light indicates that the bike is badly hang up, in this case please try again or contact the technical support on +33 (0)6 09 46 00 60.


FARE
